to the music of Joseph Haydn



Esterházy Palace, once a residence of great magnates and now a striking landmark at the heart of Burgenland's capital Eisenstadt, is one of Austria's most beautiful Baroque palaces. Today it is a museum, a venue for cultural events, a research centre, and also houses part of the Esterházy dynasty's unique private collection. Be inspired at the place where Lord Nelson listened to the music of Joseph Haydn and appreciate rooms that have stories to tell.

Haydn Hall

Historical venue
and festival forum

In the second half of the 17th century, Prince Paul I commissioned this Baroque banqueting hall and its lavish frescoes. In the 20th century, the "Great Hall" was renamed Haydn Hall and, boasting superb acoustics and decoration, it is now regarded as a jewel among concert halls worldwide.

In 2020 the Haydn Hall will again provide a breathtaking setting for the concert series *classic.Esterhazy* and for the HERBSTGOLD – Autumn Festival in Eisenstadt, which will fill the hall with music from 9 to 20 September. Austrian and international musicians as well as guests from all over the world are impressed by this unique combination of musical highlights and magnificent decoration and architecture.

Known for its outstanding acoustics, the Haydn Hall is used for over 100 concerts a year. During these concerts it will not be possible for visitors to walk around and view the hall. Thank you for your understanding!

Exhibition *Melinda Esterházy*

“Life has given me so much” –
an exhibition in five acts

This exhibition conveys an authentic picture of Melinda Esterházy, née Ottrubay, both in her career as a prima ballerina assoluta and in her personal life. Appreciate glimpses of a life full of highs and lows as you find out about her ambitious career and her personal world away from the stage. You will get to know a strong personality who grew with the challenges she faced.

Room by room you can walk through the stages in Melinda Ottrubay's life, as if traversing the scenes of an opera. You will get to know the protagonist in her early life, as a trainee and prima ballerina assoluta, and later as an Esterházy princess. In five acts, the exhibition guides you through the life of the last prince and princess in the family's primogeniture line – Melinda and Paul Esterházy V.



Palace Tour

Fascinating women –
moving stories

The palace tour shows the magnificent apartment of the Esterházy princesses and provides a glimpse into the lives and worlds of three charismatic ladies: Maria Josefa Hermenegilde, née Princess Liechtenstein, passionate patroness of Joseph Haydn; Maria Theresia, née Princess von Thurn und Taxis, lionized beauty at the Congress of Vienna, and Lady Sarah Child-Villiers. Meet personalities from the past and discover the fascinating and moving stories of their loves, marital bliss and troubles.



A further highlight of this tour is the 17th-century Palace Chapel. The organ dates back to the time of Joseph Haydn and was frequently played by the great composer. The tour also includes the Haydn Hall, now world famous for its acoustics and an inspiration to Haydn in his day.

Haydn Ticket

Virtuoso craftsmanship &
musical mastery

The Haydn ticket includes two exhibitions and compellingly captures the life of Joseph Haydn, offering insights into the music, festivals and lifestyle at the Esterházy court.

Haydn explosive

Joseph Haydn served the Esterházy princes as Hofkapellmeister and composer for some 40 years. Multimedia stations, project installations, and unusual exhibits offer an insight into the life of this musical genius – from his early compositions in Eisenstadt to stardom in London and his late work – and also explore his influence as a composer both in the past and the present. Included in the displays are the maestro's personal and professional documents as well as original instruments like the fortepiano that belonged to his patron Princess Maria Josefa Hermenegilde.

Highlights of Esterházy Palace

This unique tour presents important art-historical exhibits from the collection and an impression of the lavish life and festivities at the princely court. Attractions include the Esterházy silverware – the world's largest surviving Neoclassical silver tableware service – and a console table from the workshops of Giuseppe Briati in Venice. This exhibition also includes some fascinating glimpses of the palace's past in the building itself. In a few places the original walls and floors have been uncovered revealing the layers of history contained within an over three-hundred-year-old palace.



Wine Museum

A cellar full of culture

Why not explore Austria's largest wine museum? In the over 300-year-old vaults of the palace, there are 700 unique objects relating to wine and wine-making just waiting to be discovered – from historic barrels to Burgenland's oldest *Baumpresse* (a basket wine press). Encounter the long history of Esterhazy's "bacchanalian" side! For even back in 1666, the palace's cellars could accommodate tens of thousands of litres, and servants – including Joseph Haydn – would sometimes be paid in "pails" of wine. From the study of vines and viticulture under the Esterházy princes to distillation or the production of wine and Sekt (Austrian sparkling wine), here everything revolves around the joys of the grape.

The orangery has always been an ideal venue for celebrations – for parties, summer festivities and corporate functions. Since being revitalized some 20 years ago, this classical jewel in the palace park has provided a popular setting for weddings and balls in addition to conferences and corporate events. And the overall setting of the Baroque Esterházy Palace with its spacious park surrounding the orangery adds to the magic of this location.

This historical building is not only remarkable for its unique ambience but also as a versatile space. In good weather, the parterre in front of the orangery can also be enjoyed. The orangery accommodates up to 600 guests.



Forchtenstein Castle

Bulwark, armoury, treasure chamber –
“strongbox” of delights



Dating back to the early 14th century, Forchtenstein Castle was acquired by the Esterházy family in 1626. They commissioned the structure we see today – a soaring edifice and bulwark that is Burgenland’s most imposing landmark. The Esterházy’s weapons and armour are stored here to this day. Prince Paul I, the founding father of the princely dynasty, also established his unique treasure chamber, which he proudly described as his “Kunst-kammer” (cabinet of curiosities) in his will, as well as an extensive archive at this location. Even now, the castle is bathed in the magic of bygone days. Whether you wish to explore history or celebrate in style, Forchtenstein Castle is a truly unique location.

Castle Tour with Weapons Collection

A journey through history

Discover impressive rooms steeped in history on this tour through the castle. Explore the fascinating sights of the castle known as the "Baroque stronghold", including the inner courtyard with the largest secco murals north of the Alps. The oratory, chapel and kitchens complete your tour. At this former bulwark you can encounter four hundred years of the Esterházy princes and their military tradition.



Grenades, Flags, Grenadiers

Treasures from the historic arsenal of the Esterházy princes

Forchtenstein Castle, site of one of Europe's earliest museums, was an arsenal and armoury for the Esterházy princes over a long period. The exhibition "Grenades, Flags, Grenadiers" presents impressive glimpses of one of Europe's largest private armouries in ten rooms.

Heroes, Treasures, Booty

Highlights from the collections
at Forchtenstein Castle

Prince Paul Esterházy I set the scene for the myths surrounding his family. He commissioned hundreds of portraits of legendary ancestors, historical personalities and a large number of monarchs. This historical 17th-century gallery even includes portraits of Attila the Hun and Vlad the Impaler, the inspiration for Count Dracula in Bram Stoker's famous novel. These depictions of real and imagined ancestors is Europe's largest surviving collection of Baroque family portraits, an impressive rendition of the Esterházy genealogy.

Exquisite objects and rarities from the 17th-century treasure chamber testify to the princes' passion for collecting. Highlights include Baroque silver furniture, clocks, automatons, jewellery, and cups crafted from gemstones. At its heart is the silver table decorated with the "Judgement of Paris", originally a diplomatic gift for the Ottomans. Ottoman weapons and artefacts, especially a well-preserved state tent, are relics of their time, reflecting the political relations of the Esterházy family and their battle against Europe's most-feared enemy in the 16th and 17th centuries.



Esterházy Treasure Chamber

Mysterious worlds of wonder –
rarities galore

Once hidden down secret passageways, shut away behind ingenious locks and protected by psalms, the Esterházy Treasure Chamber has survived through the centuries largely intact.

Immerse yourself in mysterious worlds and appreciate a truly fascinating place. Comprising historical cabinets, filled with remarkable artworks and natural history specimens, the Esterházy Treasure Chamber is a cabinet of curiosities still located at its original location. Abundant cabinets with glass doors provide glimpses of the precious and rare objects housed within. Marvel at clocks from Augsburg, cups fashioned from agate and rock crystal, turned ivory and bone artefacts, miniatures made of delicate silver wire, and much more besides.



Amassed over 300 Years, Stolen in 3 Days

The Esterházy Treasure Chamber
in the turmoil of the 20th century

Forchtenstein Castle was extended in the 17th century under Prince Paul Esterházy I. His new *Kunstkammer* (cabinet of curiosities) was also enriched with objects from the treasury of his father, Count Nikolaus Esterházy, and his successors continued to add their treasures in later times. Hidden away and protected, until the early 20th century this outstanding collection was completely untouched.

Then, on 1 April 1919, officials from the Hungarian Republic of Councils from Sopron appeared at Forchtenstein Castle and confiscated some 280 objects. Including precious metalwork, jewellery and textiles, these artefacts were deposited in Budapest where they have remained to this day, mostly locked away from both the general public and scholars.

This exhibition at Forchtenstein Castle is dedicated to these events about one hundred years ago and clearly reveals the gaps in the collection resulting from the seizure of these works of art.

In the 2020 season, the exhibition will be extended to include artefacts from the historical *Kunstkammer*. Placed in the context of the events of 1919, these works of art compellingly show the symbolic significance of this confiscation. In addition, the latest research into the Republic of Councils in the area of modern-day Burgenland sheds light on the events at Forchtenstein Castle a century ago.



Café Restaurant Grenadier

Design meets history

The modern restaurant at Forchtenstein Castle uses authentic materials like wood, dark metal, and ceramic to meld with this distinctive historical setting. The rooms have capacity for up to 120 guests, are partially located on different levels, and can also be used as separate units. A stunning view across the Pannonian countryside can be appreciated from the adjoining terrace.

Café Restaurant Grenadier aims to cater to all its guests' tastes. Choose from classics like Wiener Schnitzel, beef goulash or boiled beef and new seasonal creations. For a light bite and for bus groups on a tight schedule, traditional snacks can also be ordered ranging from the "Castle Bretteljause" to Sacher sausages – all to be enjoyed looking out at a stunning view.



Lackebach Palace Museum

See, touch and enjoy



Lackebach Palace Museum has plenty to offer visitors interested in nature and in hunting.

The exhibition “The Esterházy Princes and the Courtly Hunt” introduces the world of the courtly hunt with historical objects telling of four centuries of hunting by the Esterházy family. Life-sized forest-dwelling animals will leave children in wide-eyed amazement. On park tours nature-lovers have a chance to find out more about the distinctive flora and will be introduced to both rare regional plants as well as sequoias and other exotic giant trees.

Tour of the garden and museum

The tour begins at the arboretum where you can discover rare trees and listen to fascinating tales of sequoias and other trees. It continues through the vegetable garden into the historic courtyard with its impressive Renaissance arcades. This is followed by a visit to the museum before a chance to

round off your trip at the café with its ice-cream parlour. Try our speciality Esterházy slice-flavoured ice cream or recharge with a snack, cake and other refreshments.

TIP!

Explore the wetlands park

Walking through the impressive park, past the romantic, meandering Selitza Stream, you can find out all about the characteristic flora and fauna. In addition to rare native plants, discover sequoias and other exotic giant trees that were planted at Lackebach over one hundred years ago. Both amateur and expert gardeners will acquire some useful tips to try out back at home.

TIP!

Journey through the court park

The excursion through the court park starts at the arboretum with its over one-hundred-year-old trees. It continues through the large orchard, past the “Königshügel” (king’s hill) and palace moat, through the meadows of the stately kitchen garden and the Gärtnerhof. At various stations on the tour you are invited to work with materials from nature and plants. You can take your work home as a souvenir of your excursion to Lackebach Palace.

NEW!

From spring 2020!

In commemoration of the Battle of Lackebach in 1620, Lackebach Palace and Neckemarkt’s flag-throwing and viticulture museum will be joining forces to stage an exhibition. Glass and iron hand grenades, “basket missiles”, bullets for wall guns and other objects document the weapons once used in warfare.

Guest Houses in Lackenbach Palace Park

Modern design in historic rooms



A further attraction was added to Lackenbach Palace in spring 2018: "Zum Oberjäger" guest house was opened.

The listed building with four rooms and two suites, is located in the palace park's arboretum. The interior combines history with modern design and facilities and reflects the garden and nature with added elements influenced by hunting. Guests can choose from the rooms Mulberry, Rose, Dragonfly and Butterfly, and the two suites called Bird and Cherry. Their names were inspired by the region's flora and fauna or the historical painting of the interior.

Breakfast is prepared and served in the "cookery salon". This well-equipped kitchen has enough space to hold cookery seminars and can be used by guests to make small evening meals.

St. Margarethen Quarry

Prehistoric giant and World Heritage Site



St. Margarethen Quarry is one of Europe's oldest and largest quarries. Its sandy limestone has been quarried here since antiquity and continues to be extracted today. It was used to build and restore St. Stephen's Cathedral and also for buildings around the Ringstrasse in Vienna. Originally formed by a prehistoric inland sea, in the 20th century an abundance of important fossils were discovered in this ancient stone (some a staggering 25 million years old). In 2001 St. Margarethen Quarry and the region of Fertö-Neusiedlersee were added to the UNESCO List of World Heritage Sites.

Tours

In addition to the quarry tour, groups can also book nature tours around the quarry. These focus on the unique fauna and flora as well as the impressive sculptures and introduce you to magical energizing places and viewpoints. Sturdy footwear required!

Opera in the Quarry

Powerful emotions in a unique setting



St. Margarethen Quarry also boasts one of Europe's most impressive open-air stages. In fact there are two arenas hewn from stone: the large stage, a huge outdoor concert hall with space for an audience of almost 5,000 people, and the Ruffini stage with up to 2,300 seats.

In 2020 the Opera in the Quarry is proud to present a great classic of Italian opera – Giacomo Puccini's "Turandot". With his "Nessun dorma!" (none shall sleep), Puccini succeeded in creating one of the most popular arias in the whole of opera. The composer's lustrous and mysteriously jagged sounds find their perfect echo in the rugged rocky landscape of St. Margarethen Quarry. The premiere is on 8 July 2020.
